Bioeconomy: 3 Challenges & Putative Solutions Facing Publically Funded R&D Providers

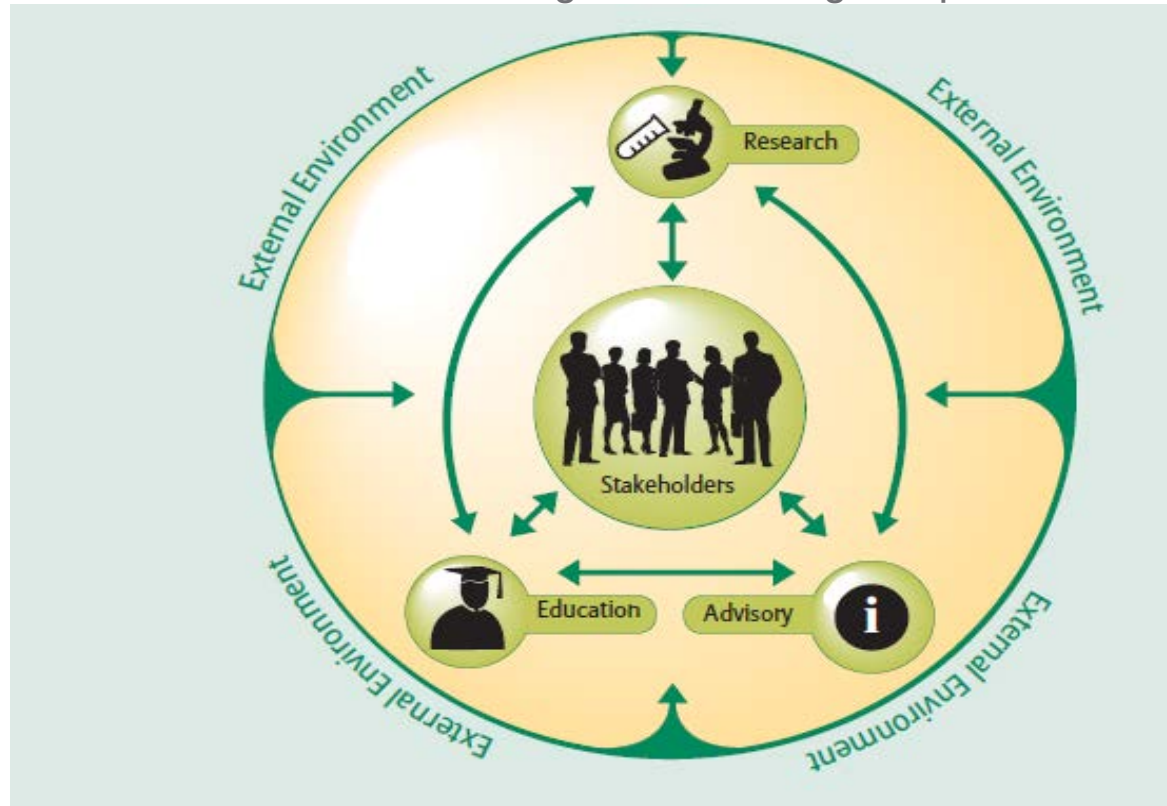
- The information and knowledge transfer gap that exists between researchers and the industry (primary and processing)

“Knowledge failures” – an arresting conclusion!

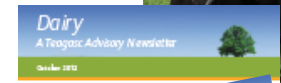
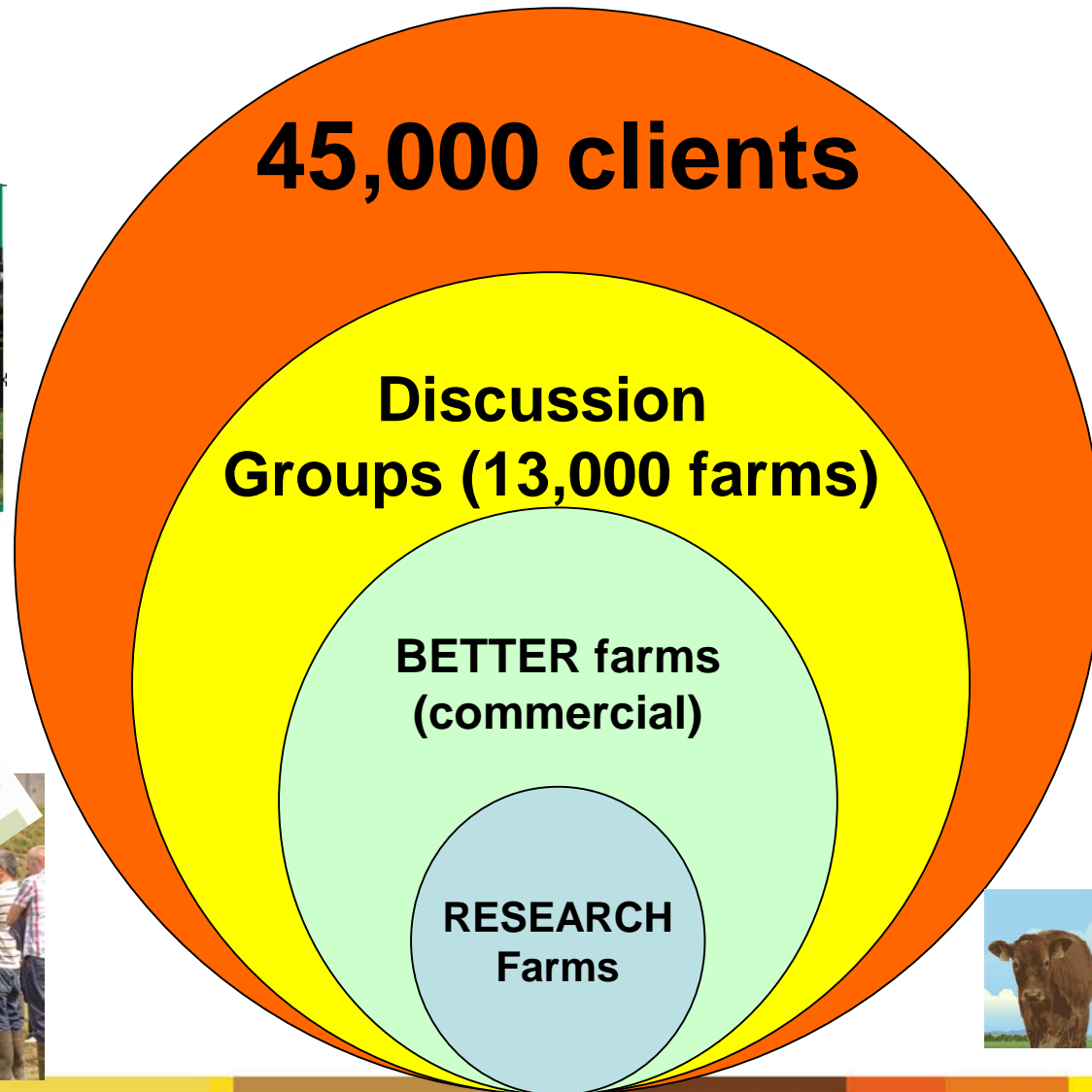

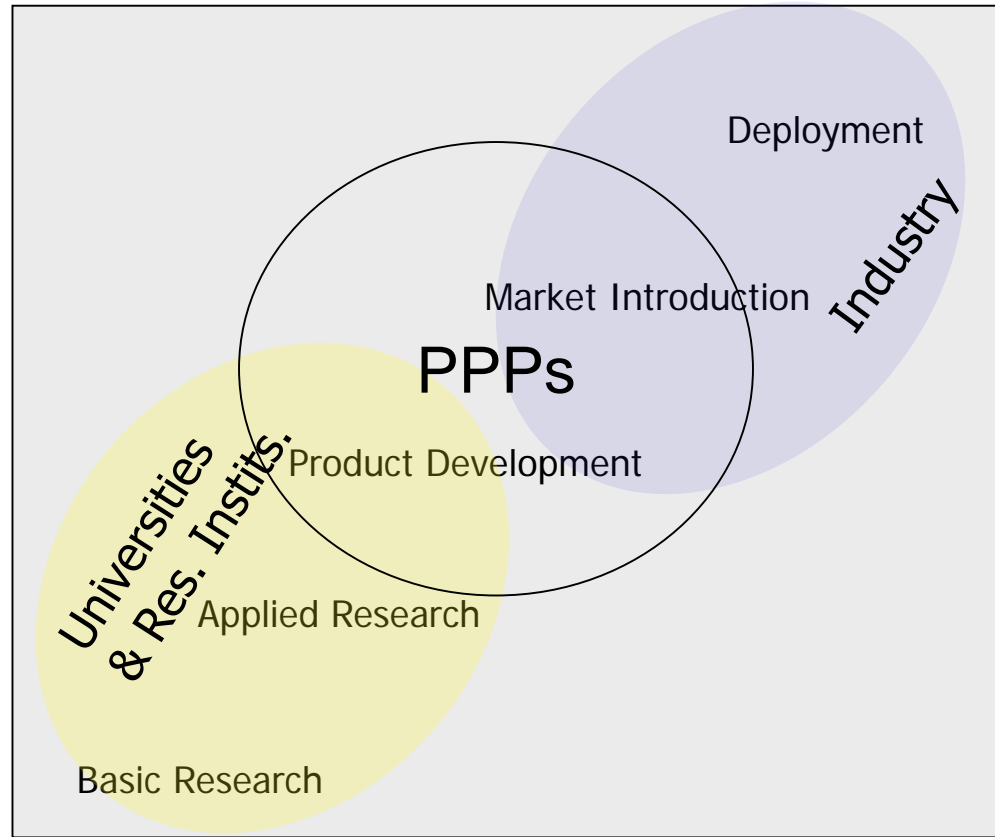

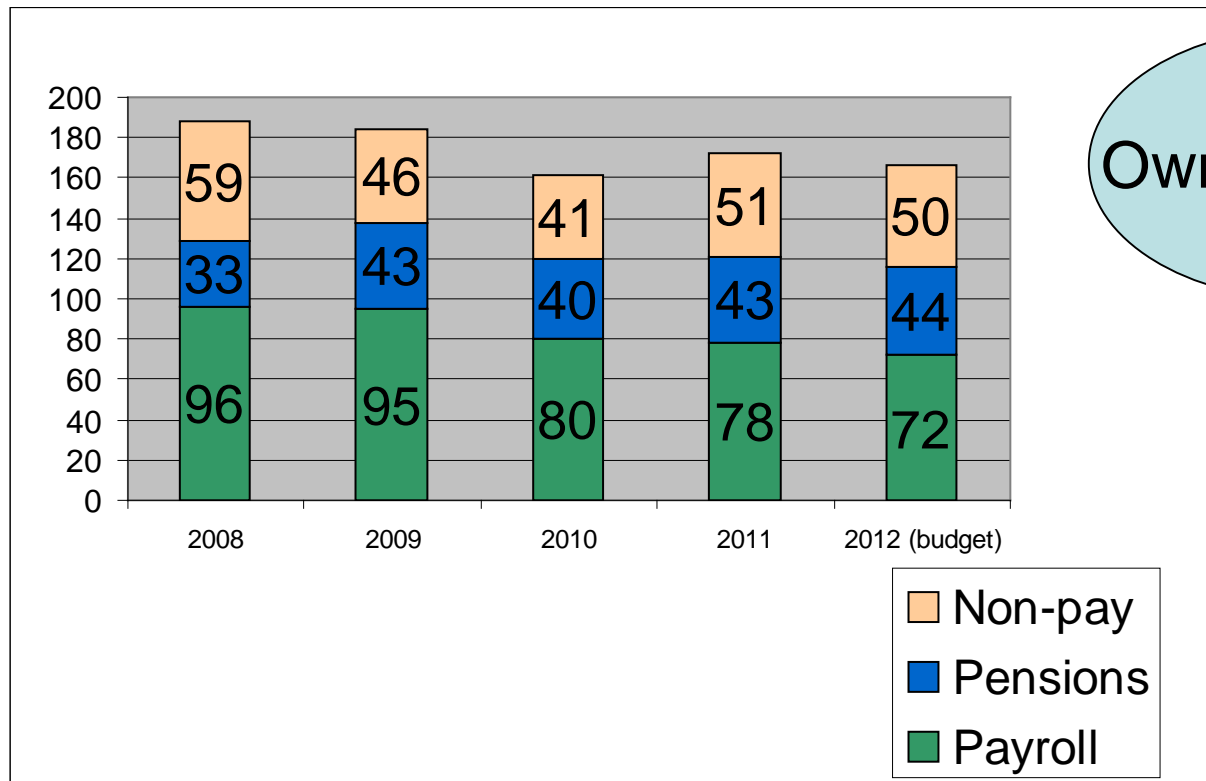
